"Admonish one another"

Congratulations, you did it! You have come to the end of our study of the "one anothers" of Scripture. Believe it or not, we didn't have time to cover them all! I trust that you will take the time to search out the other statements and endeavor to put them into practice.

In this final week we study a statement that is made throughout Scripture but especially in Romans 15:14, "Now I myself am confident, my brethren, that you also are full of goodness, filled with all knowledge, able also to admonish one another."

The Greek word for "admonish" speaks of correction, of warning. Admittedly, this may seem like a strange injunction to practice in a loving community. How is it loving to correct another? But the truth is, true love is willing to take the risk and correct another who is in sin. As Gene Getz writes, "There is no greater sign of love than to be willing to risk rejection and broken relationships with others. And if admonishment is done in the right spirit, with the right motive, using the appropriate method, the person who is not living a life worthy of the Gospel of Christ usually senses the risk you are taking." 1

Reflect

Admonishment does not mean that we go around looking for faults in others. No, it must be done with the proper goal. Today, we discovered that the objective is to help others become more mature in Christ. So reflect ... when you admonish another do you do so out of the desire, not to tear them down or embarrass them, but to build them up and become mature in the faith?

Pray

❖ Lord speak to me, that I may speak in living echoes of Thy tone; As Thou has sought, so let me seek Thy erring children lost and alone.

O teach me, Lord, that I may teach the precious things Thou dost impart; And wing my words, that they may reach the hidden depth of many a heart.

O fill me with Thy fullness, Lord, until my very heart o'erflow, In kindling tho't and glowing word, Thy love to tell, Thy praise to show.

O use me, Lord, use even me, just as Thou wilt and when and where; Until Thy blessed face I see, Thy rest, Thy joy Thy glory share."²

❖ Two weeks from today we welcome Rev. Eric Campbell as our new interim pastor. As he gives himself fully to the work of the Lord pray that he would continue to stand firm, letting nothing move him, "knowing that his labor in the Lord is not in vain." (1 Corinthians 15:58)

Reflect

It may be that none of us can say that we are "full of goodness." But the truth remains that if you are deliberately violating the Word of God you really can't effectively admonish another. You must first deal with the sin in your own life. Do it today, reach out for help if needed, but don't put it off any longer. Deal with the sin in your own heart by repenting, confessing and getting help to walk in the way of righteousness.

Pray

"Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin." (Psalm 51:2)

For our church:

❖ Give thanks to God for our visioning events this past month. Thank God for the joy we experienced in being together and dreaming about what God has in store for us as a church. Pray that we continue to depend on God to grant us a vision for ministry in Wyoming and beyond. Pray that God's promise would be realized in us, "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visons, your old men will dream dreams. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy." (Acts 2:17,18)

- May I hear you again say, I am with you always, to the very end of the age and may we find courage and strength in that promise to meet all things.³
